

Exploration Update – Drilling Continues

- Wilandra Reverse Circulation (RC) and Diamond (DD) drill program is progressing with 2,224 metres completed, with highly encouraging early results
- 14m of semi-massive to massive sulphide mineralisation intersected in deepest hole drilled at Wilandra Central to date, with logging, sampling and assaying underway
- RC drill program set to commence at Black Hills and Cymbric Vale prospects within two weeks

G11 Resources Limited ('G11 Resources', 'G11' or 'the Company') is pleased to provide an update on exploration activities at its 100% owned Koonenberry Project, NSW.

Although somewhat delayed by a significant wet weather event, the Wilandra Central drill program is progressing well with four holes completed for over 2,224 metres of drilling (639m RC and 1,585m DD).

The step-out drill program at Wilandra Central has successfully intersected over 14m (downhole width) of stringer to massive sulphide mineralisation in GR24RCD002. Logging of this hole has identified pyrite and pyrrhotite as the dominant sulphide species, with variable concentrations of chalcopyrite and sphalerite logged within specific intervals. Samples from this hole will be dispatched for cutting and then sent for analysis. Assays for this and other intercepts within the program will be reported to the market as they become available.

Of note, the intercept in GR24RCD002 is some 400m below mineralised drill intercepts previously demonstrated in the shallower part of the Peveril lode in this area. Downhole Electromagnetic (DHEM) surveys will be completed on all holes within the program, which will hopefully provide further confidence in the continuity of this mineralisation between intercepts.

Priority drill programs are set to commence within two weeks at the Black Hills and Cymbric Vale Cu prospects, located approximately 25kms to the west of Wilandra Central, within the Cymbric Vale Corridor. A recent site visit by Dr John Stewart, a consultant structural geologist, accompanied by the G11 technical team has reinforced the prospectivity of these targets.

As G11 are committed to operating to the highest possible environmental standards, the Company has recently completed a fauna survey over the two drill areas at Cymbric Vale. Once results from the survey have been received, an RC drill rig will commence drilling operations testing these exciting Cymbric Vale Corridor targets.

The Company looks forward to providing further updates on the drilling programs at both Wilandra and Cymbric Vale to the market as additional information becomes available.
