EXPLANATORY STATEMENT TO SHAREHOLDERS

1. ACTION TO BE TAKEN BY SHAREHOLDERS

This Explanatory Statement sets out information about the Resolutions to be considered by the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting. Defined terms used in this Explanatory Statement are set out in the section headed 'Definitions' in the Explanatory Statement. Accompanying this Explanatory Statement is the Notice of Annual General Meeting convening the Annual General Meeting and a Proxy Form.

Shareholders are encouraged to attend and vote on the Resolutions to be put to the Annual General Meeting. If a Shareholder is not able to attend and vote at the Annual General Meeting, the Shareholder may complete the Proxy Form and return it no later than 48 hours before the time specified for the commencement of the Annual General Meeting.

2. ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORTS

The Corporations Act requires the Company's financial statements and reports of the Directors and of the auditor for the year ended 30 June 2017 to be laid before the Annual General Meeting. The financial statements and the reports of the Directors and of the auditor are contained in the Company's 2017 Annual Report, a copy of which is available on the Company's website at www.altometals.com.au.

Whilst no Resolution is required in relation to this item, Shareholders should consider the documents and raise any matters of interest with the Directors when this item is being considered.

A representative from the Company's auditors will be invited to the meeting and Shareholders will have an opportunity to ask the auditor questions in relation to the conduct of the audit, the auditor's report, the Company's accounting policies and the independence of the auditor.

3. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

The Remuneration Report is required to be considered for adoption in accordance with section 250R of the Corporations Act. The Remuneration Report sets out the Company's remuneration arrangements for the Directors and senior management of the Company. The Remuneration Report is part of the Directors' Report contained in the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ending 30 June 2017.

A reasonable opportunity will be given for the discussion of the Remuneration Report at the Annual General Meeting. Shareholders should note that the vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Company or the Directors.

If at least 25% of the votes cast on the Resolution are voted against adoption of the Remuneration Report at the Annual General Meeting, and then again at the Company's 2018 annual general meeting, the Company will be required to put to Shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of an extraordinary general meeting to consider the appointment of Directors of the Company ("Spill Resolution"). If more than 50% of Shareholders vote in favour of the Spill Resolution, the Company must convene the extraordinary general meeting ("Spill Meeting") within 90 days of the Company's 2018 annual general meeting. All of the Directors who were in office when the Company's 2018 Directors' Report was approved, other than the Managing Director of the Company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting. Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as Directors is approved will be the Directors of the Company.

The Company's Shareholders have approved the Remuneration Report at the previous annual general meeting. A Spill Resolution will not be required at this Annual General Meeting as the votes against the Remuneration Report at the Company's 2016 annual general meeting were less than 25%.

The Chairman intends to exercise all undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 1. If the Chairman of the Annual General Meeting is appointed as your proxy and you have not specified the way the Chairman is to vote on Resolution 1, by signing and returning the Proxy Form, the Shareholder is considered to have provided the Chairman with an express authorisation for the Chairman to vote the proxy in accordance with the Chairman's intention.

4. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR STEPHEN STONE

Clause 16.4(a) of the Constitution requires that at the Company's annual general meeting in every year, one-third of the Directors, except the Managing Director, must retire from office provided that no Director may hold office without re-election past the third AGM following the Director's appointment or 3 years, whichever is longer. The Directors to retire at an annual general meeting are those who have been longest in office since their last appointment, but, as between persons who became Directors on the same day, those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agreed amongst themselves) be determined by drawing lots. A Director who retires by rotation under clause 16.4(a) of the Constitution is eligible for re-election.

In accordance with clause 16.4(a) of the Constitution and ASX Listing Rule 14.4, Mr Stephen Stone is required to retire and being eligible for election, offers himself for re-election.

Mr Stone is currently Managing Director of the ASX Listed Azumah Resources Limited. He graduated with honours in Mining Geology from University of Wales, Cardiff and has since gained more than 30 years' operating, project evaluation, executive management and corporate development experience in the international mining and exploration industry.

Mr Stone worked for several years at the large open pit and underground copper mines of the Zambian Copperbelt. He came to Australia in 1986 and since then has been involved in the formation and management of several junior ASX listed exploration companies.

Mr Stone is a Member of the Australasian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy, a Fellow of the Australian Institute of Company Directors and a member of the Editorial Board of International Mining Magazine.

The Board (other than Mr Stone) unanimously supports the re-election of Mr Stone.

5. RESOLUTION 3 – ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR TERRY WHEELER

Clause 16.3(b) of the Constitution requires that any Director appointed by the Board, either to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the Board, must retire at the next general meeting following his or her appointment, but is eligible for re-election at that general meeting (and is not be taken into account in determining the number of directors for the purposes of retirement by rotation under clause 16.4 of the Constitution).

In accordance with clause 16.3(b) of the Constitution, since he was elected to the Board to fill a casual vacancy on 9 September 2016, Mr Wheeler is required to retire and being eligible for election, offers himself for re-election.

Mr Wheeler commenced employment as a laboratory assistant at the DSIR (Department of Scientific & Industrial Research) in London in 1958 and achieved his academic qualifications whilst gaining excellent practical work experience. He migrated to Perth, Western Australia, in 1967 and joined Western Mining Corporation, where his mineral analysis experience was gained, and with further study and qualifications he was promoted to Chief Chemist of the Kambalda Nickel Operation in the Eastern Goldfields.

Terry and his wife Christina established Genalysis Laboratory Services in 1975, and grew the company into one of the largest and most successful analytical companies in the southern hemisphere with over 300 technical staff. In 2007, Genalysis Laboratory Services was purchased by Intertek Group plc.

Terry is a Fellow of the Royal Australian Chemical Institute, a Member of the Australasian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy Inc., a Member of the Association of Exploration Geochemists, and an Associate Member of the International Association of Geoanalysts.

The Board (other than Mr Wheeler) unanimously supports the election of Mr Wheeler.

6. RESOLUTION 4 – RATIFICATION OF ISSUE OF PLACEMENT SHARES

General

On 24 October 2017, the Company announced that it had completed a capital raising by way of a placement to raise approximately \$1.6 million (before costs) comprising the issue of 21,350,000 Shares at an issue price of \$0.075 per Share to sophisticated and professional investors (**Placement**).

The Placement is comprised of two tranches:

- (a) an issue of 11,616,667 Shares to sophisticated and professional investors who are not related parties of the Company (**Placement Shares**); and
- (b) an issue of 9,733,333 Shares to Directors of the Company (or their respective nominees), comprised of the following:
 - (i) 9,066,667 Shares to Mr Terry Wheeler (a Director of the Company), or his nominee (the subject of Resolution 5); and
 - (ii) 666,667 Shares to Mr Dermot Ryan (a Director of the Company), or his nominee (the subject of Resolution 6).

The Placement Shares were issued on 24 October 2017.

Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder approval pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 for the ratification of the issue of the Placement Shares.

Resolution 4 is an ordinary resolution.

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 4.

Listing Rule 7.1

Listing Rule 7.1 provides that a company must not, subject to specified exceptions, issue or agree to issue more Equity Securities during any 12 month period than that amount which represents 15% of the number of fully paid ordinary securities on issue at the commencement of that 12 month period.

The effect of Resolution 4 will be to allow the Company to issue the Placement Shares during the period of 3 months after the Meeting (or a longer period, if allowed by ASX), without using the Company's 15% annual placement capacity.

Specific information required by Listing Rule 7.5

Listing Rule 7.5 requires that the following information be provided to Shareholders in relation to the issue of the Placement Shares:

- (a) 11,616,667 Shares were issued as Placement Shares;
- (b) the Placement Shares were issued at \$0.075 per Share;
- (c) the Placement Shares are fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company, ranking equally in all respects with the Company's existing Shares on issue;
- (d) the Placement Shares were issued to sophisticated and professional investors who were not related parties of the Company;
- (e) the Company intends to use the funds raised from the Placement to pay for the continuation of work at the Sandstone Gold Project and will include drill targeting of extensions to existing mineral resources, drill targeting of other prospect area and for general working capital; and
- (f) a voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice.

7. RESOLUTION 5 AND RESOLUTION 6 - PARTICIPATION IN PLACEMENT BY RELATED PARTIES

General

Mr Terry Wheeler and Mr Dermot Ryan (Directors of the Company) wish to participate in the Placement, subject to Shareholder approval.

Resolution 5 and Resolution 6 seeks Shareholder approval for the issue of up to 9,066,667 Placement Shares to Mr Wheeler (or his nominees) and the issue of up to 666,667 Placement Shares to Mr Ryan (or his nominees) arising from their participation in the Placement respectively (**Participation**).

Resolution 5 and Resolution 6 are ordinary resolutions.

The Board (other than Mr Wheeler) recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 5. The Board (other than Mr Ryan) recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 6.

Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act and Listing Rule 10.11

In accordance with Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act, in order to give a financial benefit to a related party, the Company must:

- (a) obtain Shareholder approval in the manner set out in section 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act; and
- (b) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval,

unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act.

The Participation will result in the issue of Placement Shares to Mr Wheeler and Mr Ryan which constitutes giving a financial benefit and Mr Wheeler and Mr Ryan who are related parties of the Company by virtue of being a Director.

The Directors (other than Mr Wheeler and Mr Ryan) consider that Shareholder approval pursuant to Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is not required in respect of the Participation because the Shares will be issued to Mr Wheeler and Mr Ryan on the same terms as the Placement Shares being issued to non-related party participants in the Placement and as such the giving of the financial benefit is on arm's length terms.

Listing Rule 10.11 also requires shareholder approval to be obtained where an entity issues, or agrees to issue, securities to a related party, or a person whose relationship with the entity or a related party is, in ASX's opinion, such that approval should be obtained unless an exception in Listing Rule 10.12 applies.

As the Participation involves the issue of Placement Shares to a related party of the Company, Shareholder approval pursuant to Listing Rule 10.11 is required unless an exception applies. It is the view of the Directors (other than Mr Wheeler and Mr Ryan) that the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 10.12 do not apply in the current circumstances.

Approval pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 is not required for the Participation as approval is being obtained under Listing Rule 10.11. Accordingly, the issue of the Placement Shares to Mr Wheeler and Mr Ryan will not be included in the use of the Company's 15% annual placement capacity pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1.

Specific information required by Listing Rule 10.13

Pursuant to, and in accordance with Listing Rule 10.13, the following information is provided in relation to the Participation:

- (a) the Placement Shares will be issued to Mr Wheeler (or his nominees) and Mr Ryan (or his nominees);
- (b) the maximum number of Placement Shares to be issued to Mr Wheeler (or his nominees) is 9,066,667 Shares, and the maximum number of Placement Shares to be issued to Mr Ryan (or his nominees) is 666,667;
- (c) the Shares will be issued no later than 1 month after the date of the Meeting (or such later date to the extent permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the Listing Rules);
- (d) the issue price will be \$0.075 per Share, being the same as the Placement Shares were issued to sophisticated and professional investors under the Placement;
- the Shares issued to Mr Wheeler (or his nominees) and Mr Ryan (or his nominees) will be fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company issued on the same terms and conditions as the Company's existing Shares;
- (f) the Company intends to use the funds raised from the Participation to pay for the continuation of work at the Sandstone Gold Project and will include drill targeting of extensions to existing mineral resources, drill targeting of other prospect area and for general working capital; and
- (g) a voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice.

Voting By Proxy - How to complete the Proxy Form

Your Name, Address and Shareholder Details

Please complete your name, address and SRN or HIN as it appears on the Share register of Alto Metals Limited.

Appointment of a Proxy

Please write the name of that person you wish to appoint as proxy in the space indicated. If you leave this section blank, or your named proxy does not attend the meeting, the Chairman will be your proxy and vote on your behalf. A proxy need not be a shareholder of Alto Metals Limited.

Votes on Items of Business

You may direct your proxy how to vote by placing a mark one of the three boxes opposite each item of business. All your shares will be voted in accordance with such a direction unless you indicate only a portion of voting rights on any item by inserting the percentage or number of shares you wish to vote in the appropriate box or boxes. If you do not mark any of the boxes on a given item, your proxy will vote as he or she chooses. If you mark more than one box on an item your vote on that item will be invalid.

To appoint a second proxy you must state the percentage of your voting rights on each of the first Proxy Form and the second Proxy Form and return both forms together.
