

QUARTERLY ACTIVITIES REPORT FOR PERIOD ENDED 30 JUNE 2024

Equus Mining Limited ('Equus' or 'Company') **(ASX: EQE)** herein provides an update on its activities for the June 2024 Quarter.

During the quarter that ended 31 March 2024 the Group concluded the transaction for the disposal of all the Chilean assets of Equus (the "Transaction") to Andean Silver Limited (ASX:ASL), formerly Mitre Mining Corporation Limited (ASX:MMC).

SEPTEMBER 2024 QUARTER - PLANNED ACTIVITY

- ▶ Equus Mining is continuing to actively review other investment opportunities.
- ▶ Per the terms of the Transaction, should Andean Silver Limited (ASX:ASL) announce a resource greater than 100 million ounces of silver equivalent at a grade above 300g/t silver equivalent within 5 years from the date of the Transaction, then Equus will receive A\$1.0 million in cash or shares from Andean Silver Limited.

CORPORATE

- At 30 June 2024, Equus had cash of \$39,000
- ► There was no expenditure on exploration
- ▶ During the June quarter, the aggregate payments to related parties of the entity and their associates totalled \$17,000. All of these payments were for Directors' remuneration and superannuation.
- ▶ During the June quarter, the directors focus was on reviewing investment opportunities for Equus.
