Share Placement Proceeds Received

Venturex Resources (ASX: VXR) advises that it has received total proceeds of \$14 million from its recent share placement (see ASX release dated February 24, 2021).

Eligible shareholders have until 5.00pm AWST Monday, 12 July 2021 to take up the fully underwritten one-for-seven Entitlement Offer, which will raise a further \$4.9m.

The Placement and Entitlement Offer shares will come with a one-for-two attaching option, exercisable at 13.5c with a two-year expiry. If all of these options are exercised, Venturex would receive a further \$15.5 million net proceeds.

The Proceeds from the Equity Raising are intended to be used to fund:

- Development activities for the Sulphur Springs copper-zinc project including:
 - TSF geotechnical verification of design
 - Infill drilling at Sulphur Springs
 - Regional exploration
 - FEED study
- Corporate and general working capital
