UTAH SENATOR DAVID HINKINS JOINS AT4 AS AN ADVISOR

- **AT4 has appointed Utah State Senator David Hinkins as an advisor to the Board.**
- **Senator Hinkins is Utah's longest-serving senator, having been elected in 2008 and commencing service in January 2009.**

- **AT4 is advancing plans to restart its fully permitted Dutch Mountain tungsten processing facility and progress development of the Antimony Canyon Project (ACP), both in Utah.**

He is also passionate about rural Utah and can see the merit and mutual benefit offered by development of our projects in helping to deliver new jobs, provide new skills and boost economies outside the major cities."

AT4 is working to re-establish domestic production of critical minerals vital to defense, clean energy, and strategic manufacturing supply chains, including antimony via ACP and tungsten, with a growing portfolio of US-based projects to help meet increasing demand.

Its recently acquired Dutch Mountain Project and Processing Facility is the only fully permitted, operationally proven tungsten processing facility in Utah's Clifton (Gold Hill) Mining District¹, while it also recently produced the first antimony ingots from material sourced from ACP as proof of concept to support its project development strategy².
